CRITICAL PARTICIPANT MATERIAL DUE

The following information for all Scouts, Venturers, and leaders/Advisors must be returned to the jamboree registrar in the national office:

- Personal information form
- Copy of your passport or entry document

This information is necessary to ensure proper registration with The Scout Association of Great Britain for jamboree attendance. Please send the information form and a copy of your passport to the Jamboree Division, S203, Boy Scouts of America, 1325 West Walnut Hill Lane, P.O. Box

152079, Irving, TX, 75015-2079, no later than February 28, 2007. You may send them electronically to worldjamboree@netbsa.org. If you have not received your passport, please send the information form with the information you have and supplement the passport data when it arrives.

The following information must be provided to your jamboree Scoutmaster:

- Personal health and medical record form (two copies)
- Parental travel consent form
- Copy of your personal information form
- Copy of your passport or entry document

Health and Medical Record Form for Participants/Leaders

If you require a medical alert, it must be submitted before February 15, 2007, to the jamboree health and safety adviser, S230. Please use the medical form supplied online at the jamboree Web site. **Please send a copy; do not send the original form.** If you have any questions as to whether you require a medical waiver, please e-mail the health and safety adviser, bstele@netbsa.org, before the February 15 deadline.

Parental Travel Consent Form

The United Kingdom requires a notarized statement allowing entry of a minor into their country without the accompaniment of parent(s). This is not an optional form. This form will not need to be completed until you receive your airline tickets in June. The form must be completed, notarized and returned **to your Scoutmaster**. Please keep a notarized copy for your records at home. A copy of this form is available under the Forms section of this Web site.

Personal Information Form

The Scout Association has asked for assistance in collecting registration information from our participants and leaders. If you did not receive a copy in the mail, please use the personal information form available under the Forms section of this Web site. If some questions seem a little odd, remember they are collecting information from Scouts all over the world for their registration database. This form should be returned to the jamboree registrar before February 28, 2007, and a copy provided to your Scoutmaster.

Personal Health and Medical Record Form for International Service Team Members:

Medical forms are now available on our Web site, www.scouting.org/world. If a medical alert is required, a **copy** of the completed medical form must be provided to the jamboree medical officer at the national office by February 15, 2007. The address is included on the back of the medical form. This copy will remain on file and will not be returned. After the jamboree, it will be destroyed.

Service team members should be prepared to provide the original to the medical officer upon arrival at the jamboree site. This document may not be returned, so we suggest you make copies for your own personal use.

Personal Information Form for International Service Team Members:

If you have not returned this form, please complete the sheet found under the Forms section of this Web site. This information must be provided to The Scout Association so they may finalize their plans. We had requested that this document be returned by January 15, 2007, but we can amend our registration and transmit it to The Scout Association. IST Travel

The arrival date for IST members is July 24, 2007. However, the U.K. will accept any BSA IST members on July 21, with the understanding that you will be volunteering to assist with any final preparations needed and be flexible of your assignment until your official assignment beginning on July 24. All IST members will depart on August 9, 2007. The Scout Association will provide shuttle service to and from Gatwick and Heathrow airports on the above dates. There will be a check-in center at Heathrow and Gatwick for IST members to meet and depart to the jamboree site. The check-in for staff will not be at the jamboree site, so we suggest that you use the transportation provided because it is included in your jamboree fee. The Scout Association will arrange enough transportation to meet the demands. We will have an IST coordinating staff to act as liaisons to ensure that all our IST members have transportation to and from the jamboree site. To depart from the jamboree site, the schedules will be developed to meet the needs of the departing Scouters.

REFUND POLICY FOR PARTICIPANTS AND INTERNATIONAL SERVICE TEAM MEMBERS

Written notice of cancellation should be sent to the national office in Irving, Texas, to the attention of the Jamboree Registrar, either by fax, mail, or e-mail at worldjamboree@netbsa.org prior to the jamboree. Requests made after the event will not be considered. Refunds are subject to the amounts of contractual agreements made on behalf of the applicant either participant or service team member. Deposit fees paid by alternates not selected as active participants or service team members who are not selected to serve will be refunded in full.

As of January 1, 2007, the contractual agreement made with The Scout Association for payment of the jamboree fee for the participants and service team members was transmitted. This money is nonrefundable to Boy Scouts of America.

JAMBOREE SOUVENIRS

The national Supply Group will release an online catalog of BSA World Scout Jamboree items in mid-March. You will receive the identification number and password at that time. Some items will be restricted for sale just to jamboree participants, but other items will be sold to the BSA membership.

IST UPDATE

As with all other areas of the jamboree, the preparations for the International Service Teams are progressing well. Here is a summary of the latest developments from The Scout Association of Great Britain, including key information that we would like to pass on to our IST members.

Job Allocation

The IST resource team is in the process of completing the job allocation process. We understand this to mean that they have decided how many staff members will be required to support an event or exhibit. **It is their aim to provide job assignments for our IST members in June 2007.** This is a change from the original announcement.

IST on Participant Subcamps

While the majority of IST members will camp in the adult subcamp, there will be several hundred working and camping in participant subcamps. Although every jamboree experience is different, The Scout Association is working hard to ensure that these IST members are as much a part of the adult community as everyone else. The IST Communications Team will try to ensure that nobody misses out and is working closely with subcamp teams to achieve this.

IST Briefing and Training

At the event, all IST members will be given an orientation on either July 25 or 26 and role-specific training on individual teams. We will provide more information on this nearer to jamboree time.

The IST section of the jamboree Web site will continue to be updated up to the event. The aim of the site is to provide IST members with everything they need to know about the jamboree to help develop a sense of spirit and community among the International Service Team. It is available at www.thejamboree.org/ist.

PROGRAM FOR ADULT STAFFERS

The 21st World Scout Jamboree will be a once-in-a-lifetime experience for the many thousands of participants, but it also needs thousands of adults to make it happen. Whether you are a troop leader, IST member, or contingent leader, you will undoubtedly be working hard, but the jamboree is also an opportunity for all of us to develop and learn as adults. To help all adults have the best possible experience of the event, the jamboree organizing team will be providing a fully comprehensive adult program. Here is a sample of what to expect.

Jamboree Friendship Award for Adults

Adults will have the chance to complete their own jamboree friendship award. This will be similar to the award offered to participants and will involve completing a series of challenges. It will aim to promote mutual respect, friendship, and understanding and is available to all adults who attend the jamboree to work toward during their free time.

The One World Fair

Scouting's Sunrise on August 1, 2007, will mark the start of Scouting's second century. In celebration of this, the adult subcamp will host a world fair during the afternoon. This is an opportunity for the national contingents to show the rest of the world what they have to offer.

Musical Showcase and Performing Arts

There will be plenty of opportunities for adults to share their musical talents and performing skills at the jamboree. All adults should bring their instruments, music, dance, songs, and sketches. Whether they are traditional or contemporary, there will be an amazing mixture of performers.

Excursions

Although everyone will be working very hard at the jamboree, all adults should be able to take some time off. This will give you the chance to explore the jamboree site and complete the Adult Jamboree Friendship Award. There will be some trips away from Hylands Park so adults can see a little more of the local area. These will include evening trips to Gilwell Park and day trips to London. The prices will be announced as soon as the plans are finalized.

Other Opportunities

As well as the above, adults at the jamboree will be able to take part in many activities including arts and crafts, global development village activities, sports, entertainment, and circus skills. The adult program team will work to provide a broad range of activities throughout the day and evening.

TROOP FOOD

Food will be provided to troops through the subcamps as raw ingredients. Troops will be required to collect their food allocation in the morning for breakfast and lunch provisions, and then in the evening for dinner. Each patrol will receive a copy of the *Jamboree Cookbook*, which will detail the ingredients and choices available for each meal as well as suggestions about how to prepare the ingredients.

Breakfast

Breakfast will take the form of a cold breakfast on days when the subcamps are programmed to go off site, on Sunrise Day, and on departure days. On other days, a cooked breakfast will be

issued unless troops make the choice, prior to the event, to have a cold breakfast every day.

Lunch

Lunch is designed to be portable so that it can be taken wherever the participants may be at lunchtime. On days when the subcamps are programmed to go off site, ready-made sandwiches will be provided. On other days, the ingredients will be issued for troops to make into sandwiches or to eat in a different form if they choose.

Dinner

Troops may cook the dinner ingredients in whatever way they wish. The *Jamboree Cookbook* will contain suggested recipes.

Stock Items and Substitutions

Troops will be issued a range of stock items to supplement the main menu, including cooking oil, ketchup, salt, pepper, and flour. In the sample menu below, those on non-beef or vegan diets will receive an alternative to the minced beef.

A typical menu might include:

ADULT HUB RESTAURANT FOOD

The adult hub restaurant will be open to serve breakfast and dinner to members of the IST, Contingent Support Teams, and Jamboree Organizing Team. Serving times will be sufficiently long to allow people to take these meals in the restaurant. There will be provisions for night workers to have one of their meals during the night. Example of typical meals is below:

THE DAY VISITORS EXPERIENCE

A day visit to the jamboree is a chance to experience the excitement and unique atmosphere of this special global community, where world Scouting, cultures, issues, faiths, cuisine and performance will combine to form the biggest ever world Scout jamboree.

Tickets

Tickets can be purchased in advance through the online booking process or by requesting a booking form so that there is an opportunity to choose the date and time of your visit. The Day Visitors Experience is open for eight days of the event: July 29-31 and August 2-6, 2007. Buy your tickets online at www.thejamboree.org/dayvisitors or request a booking form by e-mail at info.centre@scout.org.uk or by mail at Day Visitors Experience, The Scout Association, Gilwell Park, Chingford, London, E47QW, UK. The purchase of a ticket does not confer an automatic right of entry to the 21st World Scout Jamboree site or Hylands Park. If tickets are purchased by telephone or mail order, they will be subject to an administrative charge of ú5 per transaction. **The purchase of tickets for more than one day's visit to the 21st World Scout Jamboree and Hylands Park is prohibited.** Please note that the person named during the booking process will be required to present a form of ID along with their ticket during check-in. If that person is no longer able to attend, please contact us as soon as possible to make the change. Day visitor tickets will be sold until the day before the visit or until the capacity is sold out, whichever is earlier. In any event, the organizers reserve the right to close the ticket sales service at any time at their absolute discretion.

Registration

Tickets will show an arrival time at the Park and Ride North Weald Check-in Centre and also the departure time from Hylands Park. It is the responsibility of day visitors to ensure compliance with these times. All day visitor check-ins are at the North Weald Check-in Centre. There are no facilities to check in day visitors at the world jamboree site at Hylands Park.

Security

The organizers reserve the right to request the search of all day visitors and their personal belongings. In the event of a heightened state of security, which will be posted on the official Jamboree Web site, all day visitors may be requested to provide specific means of identification at registration.

Activities at the Jamboree

The purchase of a ticket to visit the 21st World Scout Jamboree and Hylands Park does not entitle the purchaser to participate in events or activities specifically or solely organized for the youth participants of the event.

- **World Culture** — Take part in activities that depict the cultures, communities, and people of our world. From traditional sports and board games to dances, crafts, and traditional national dress, there will be something for everyone.
- **World Issues** — Gain a greater understanding of the issues facing the world today and learn how we can all make a difference to the world in which we live. In partnership with the world's leading nongovernmental organizations, including UNESCO, UNICEF, and the Red Cross, there will be displays for you to explore and activities to try our, to

discover more about issues that affect the world today.

- **World Faiths and Beliefs** — Take part in themed activities that highlight the variety of beliefs and faiths from around the world. You can explore what faith means to people of different religions, as well as take part in cultural activities with faith, including crafts, games, and meditations.
- **World Cuisine** — Pick up food and drink and get a taste of global cuisine. Snacks and meals will be on sale from Scout-run, country-themed cafes. From Swiss fondue to German bratwurst or English afternoon tea, relax and digest a little bit of the country's culture.
- **World Performance** — Watch a cast of young people perform in the main arena. Everyone will get the opportunity to watch a show in the main arena where Scouts and Guides will perform dance and music emphasizing the international dimension of the jamboree.
- **World Scouting** — Learn how our One Promise in Scouting has generated 28 million members across the globe. In the middle of the jamboree site, the World Scout Centre is where national Scout organizations can showcase Scouting from their country, and demonstrate how, at a local level, they are helping to create a better world through their Gifts for Peace projects.

REUNION 57

The 1957 event, the 9th World Jamboree, celebrated not only the Golden Jubilee of the Brownsea Island Camp but also the centenary of the birth of Scouting's founder, Lord Robert Baden-Powell. Because of the double celebration, it was decided that a combined jamboree, Scouters' Indaba, and Rover Moot would be held. The venue chosen was Sutton Park—a beautiful natural park of 2,400 acres, close to Birmingham. Some 33,000 Scouts from 90 countries camped for 12 days in weather that ranged from a heat wave to a storm that flooded parts of the huge campsite. Many thousands more took the opportunity to camp in the surrounding countryside.

The Scout Association is seeking to make contact with those young and old who joined together in 1957, whether they were day visitors or those who stayed for the duration. They are also appealing to families of those who attended who may have badges, books, or souvenirs for a special exhibition at the jamboree site at Chelmsford, Hylands Park.

EQUIPMENT AND UNIFORM

Proper Uniforming

Proper uniforming is important for the image of each Scout/Venturer and the Scout movement. Therefore, take pride in your appearance and wear only the official uniform. The jamboree committee is eager to reduce excessive expenditures for jamboree uniforms. Those specified here are the same ones used in regular Boy Scout/Venturer activities.

Scout/Venturer and Adult Uniform

The official jamboree uniform is:

- Scout/Venturer shirt, short-sleeves casual
- Scout/Venturer shorts/trousers
- Scout/Venturer hat
- Scout/Venturer web or leather belt with buckle
- Scout /Venturer stockings
- BSA Jamboree neckerchief
- Nylon, water-repellent jacket

Units do not need to all to be identical in the same Boy Scout or Venturing uniform. It is OK to have a combination of uniform pieces—i.e., some in shorts, some in long pants.

Activities Uniform

The activities uniform for Scouts, leaders, and International Service Team members will be a jamboree T-shirt, Scout/Venturer shorts, and stockings and will include jamboree ID (badges and neckerchiefs). For some jamboree activities, swimwear will be worn; for others, old clothes can be worn.

Travel Uniform

Scouts and leaders will wear the official jamboree uniform while traveling and touring to and from the jamboree.

Official Neckerchiefs and Emblems

Two official jamboree contingent emblems and one neckerchief will be sent to participating Scouts/Venturers, adult leaders, and International Service Team members. Additional quantities can be ordered in advance.

PERSONAL/CAMPING EQUIPMENT LIST FOR PARTICIPANTS AND IST MEMBERS

This is a list of suggested items needed for the 2007 World Scout Jamboree. To guard against loss of valuables, Scouts and leaders and IST members should mark uniforms and personal equipment with their name, home address, and jamboree troop number, and store equipment in their duffel bag when not in use.

*1 Jamboree duffel bag for carrying and storage (pack frames may not be used)

*1 Jamboree day pack for carrying items needed while traveling

1 sleeping bag liner

1 stuff sack for sleeping bag

1 waterproof plastic bag (heavy duty)

1 waterproof ground cloth

2 complete Scout/Venturer jamboree uniforms (only one hat, belt, and jacket required)

1 pair of Scout/Venturer long trousers

4 sets of underwear

3 extra pairs of Scout/Venturer socks

1 set of special activity gear

2 pair pajamas or sweatsuits

1 swim suit

1 pair hiking shoes

1 laundry bag, for use in duffel bag to hold soiled clothing

1 flashlight (with fresh batteries-no flame-type lights will be permitted)

1 Scout pocket knife

1 canteen or plastic water bottle

12 clothespins (spring type)

1 lip balm

1 bottle of hand sanitizer

1 insect repellent

1 tube of sunscreen 30-45 SPF

1 small can body powder

1 wallet

Extra

socks

pair of shorts

pair of rubber-soled shoes

- pair of jeans
 - shirts (long and short sleeve)
 - (all old for unusual events)
 - 1 toilet kit containing soap in container, comb, toothbrush in container, metal mirror, and deodorant
 - 1 mess kit containing 1 knife, 1 fork, and 1 spoon
 - 2 hand towels
 - 2 bath towels
 - 1 sewing kit containing needles, thread, safety pins, buttons
 - 2 plastic or folding hangers
 - Laundry materials (detergent in plastic bag or bottle)
 - Watch
 - Duffel bag combination lock
 - Sunglasses
 - Bible, Testament, or prayer book-according to faith (optional)
 - Camera, film (optional)
 - Shoelaces, extra pair (optional)
 - Air pillow, small (optional)
 - Shaving gear (if needed-electric current is 220 volts-50 cycles) (optional)
 - 110-volt appliances will operate with an adapter that should be purchased before you leave.
 - Electrical services may not be available on the jamboree site.
